## QUICKSMART—MATHEMATICS PROGRAM

Our senior students involved in *QuickSmart* have been working with Miss Naysmith three times a week. They have been working in pairs with her and participating in flash card work,

Mental arithmetic games, computer work and individual worksheets. The sessions go for 30 minutes a day. We are pleased to report that 75% of the students participating have made remarkable improvement already, while the other 25% of students are progressing steadily.

Miss Naysmith has made flashcards for all these students (at their individual levels) to practise at home. Please remind your child to practice these daily.

On the 13th and 14th June, Miss Naysmith and I need to attend the follow up *QuickSmart* workshops to evaluate how the program is working in our school, to share our results as a school and to liaise with other schools running this program.
